Fees

Application Fee: \$10.00 (non-refundable) for new students and students re-enrolling. All fees are subject to change by the Institute Board of Trustees. Each course fee is \$55.00.

Discount: When two or more members in the same household enroll, the course fee is reduced to \$47.50 per student per course.

Payment Method:

Cash: In person only at the Institute's business office.
Check: **Payable to Logos Bible Institute.** Include name and phone number on the front of the check. Please note that by September 12, 2011 (the first night of class), **ALL TUITION MUST BE PAID AT THE TIME OF REGISTRATION.** This also includes deferred tuition payments. All payments must be received in full by 8:00 p.m. September 12, 2011.

Withdrawal

Students who cannot complete a course must officially withdraw from that course. Withdrawal must be in writing on specific forms available in the Office of Admissions and Records. Withdrawal from a course must be initiated by a student prior to the withdrawal deadline published in the Academic Calendar.

A student unable to complete an academic semester for reasons **TOTALLY BEYOND** his/her control must petition the Director of the Institute in writing for permission to withdraw from class beyond the withdrawal deadline. The petition with attached documentation must be received in the Office of Admissions and Records before the last day of the semester.

All schedule adjustments must be made in person on appropriately signed program adjustment forms. Program adjustments will not be made over the telephone. Refunds for courses dropped will be appropriated as follows:

- 100% for classes dropped within the first two weeks
- 80% for classes dropped during the 3rd week
- 50% for classes dropped during 4th week

All program adjustments will require a \$2.00 administration fee.

Tapes

For your convenience, each session will be taped. Students may purchase tapes by filling out a tape request envelope provided in the classrooms. Tape cost is \$3.00.

Chapel

Service will be held on October 17, 2011 from 7:00-7:40 pm. All students are expected to attend.

Tutoring

Available for all classes by appointment only.

Auditing

A student may enroll in a course for which he/she will receive neither a grade nor credit. A student who audits a course is permitted to attend class but is not required to submit assignments or take examinations. The fee for auditing is the same as that for enrolling for credit.
